I. CALL TO ORDER

Pledge of Allegiance

Ms. Dennis called the meeting to order at 7:04 p.m. in the Berlin High School Auditorium at 139 Patterson Way, Berlin, Connecticut. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

II. STUDENT PRESENTATION – BERLIN HIGH SCHOOL

Berlin High School Senior Shree Patel presented her Capstone Project – "How does the stock market work and why are stocks a good investment?"

III. COMMITTEE REPORTS/CORRESPONDENCE TO THE BOARD

A. Report of Student Representatives

Miss Leary reported the Berlin High School musical production *Into the Woods* will be performed March 3-6, 2022; eighth grade students were invited to the high school on February 15, 2022 for a tour, led by Upbeat members, to meet their future teachers and learn about possible courses they can take next year; and sophomore students enrolled in the AP Government and Politics class visited D.C. this past weekend with the organization Close Up.

Miss Negrao reported students in grades 8 through 11 are currently in the process of registering for courses for next year; this past weekend Upbeat hosted a trip to Mount Snow; the Upbeat pancake breakfast will be held on March 5, 2022 at Berlin High School; and the Upbeat March Leadership

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Training weekend will be held March 11-13, 2022 at Camp Woodstock. Ms. Negrao provided Board members with an update on Winter athletics.

B. Committee Reports

Mr. Oakes reported the Ad-Hoc Committee for Policy Review/Revision met on February 15, 2022 to review the policies appearing on tonight's agenda for a first reading.

Ms. Sisti reported the Community Engagement Committee met on February 3, 2022 and prepared a draft policy, incorporating language from model policies, which was shared with Shipman & Goodwin for review.

C. CREC Report

There was no report this evening.

D. Correspondence to the Board

Superintendent Benigni shared correspondences received from Laurie and Tim Oakes; Jennifer Pawelczyk; Jen DiMaio and family; and Linda Delano.

IV. NEW BUSINESS – PART I

A. Revised 2021-2022 Re-opening Plan

Superintendent Benigni presented, for the Board's approval, the revised 2021-2022 re-opening plan, which incorporates many of the changes that have taken place in recent weeks and months regarding the mitigation strategies for students and staff. A copy of the 2021-2022 Opening of School and COVID-19 Mitigation Measures was provided to Board members. Superintendent Benigni stated this is the third iteration of the opening plan, updated today, and only the yellow highlighted sections are being recommended tonight for approval. The updated highlighted mitigation measures were as follows: any student or staff member has the option to wear a mask in school settings; masks are required when students are riding district buses and vans, which are public transportation and fall under federal guidelines; assigned seating may be required on buses and vans; and school-wide events may be modified to allow for social distancing and mitigation practices.

Moved by Mr. Salina, seconded by Mr. Oakes, to approve the revised 2021-2022 reopening plan as presented.

Mr. Salina stated, based on the science and the numbers at the state level, he is comfortable with students and staff having the option to wear a mask in school settings.

In response to Dr. Sassu's question does the district have jurisdiction over revising the requirement of masks on district buses and vans, Superintendent Benigni stated not at this time.

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In response to Ms. Dennis's question, is the option to wear a mask in school settings tied to a vaccination status, Superintendent Benigni stated there is no distinction between the two. Optional mask wearing is for everyone vaccinated or not vaccinated.

Mr. Tencza stated it is his understanding that the Connecticut Department of Education and the Connecticut Department of Health has the authority to implement a mask mandate regionally, if necessary, based on spikes. In response to Mr. Tencza's question how is this authority built into the revised reopening plan, Superintendent Benigni stated authority has been given, by legislation, for the State Department of Education to put a mask requirement back into place should the metrics require.

B. Review and Possible Adoption of the Proposed Board of Education Budget for 2022-2023

The Board of Education reviewed and discussed the Superintendent's Proposed Budget for 2022-2023. The Board met on January 24 to review the budget details, including information from presentations by central office administration. Earlier this evening, the Board held an informational meeting for the public so community members could provide input on the budget prior to approval. Ms. Dennis provided highlights from that presentation. The Board of Education and the Board of Finance will hold a joint meeting on March 2 to discuss the adopted budget.

Moved by Mr. Salina, seconded by Dr. Sassu, to adopt the Board of Education Operating Budget for the 2022-2023 year in the amount of \$50,122,596.

Danielle Jurich, teacher of Family and Consumer Science at Berlin High School, requested an unpaid leave of absence, for childrearing purposes, to begin immediately following her maternity leave through the 2021-2022 school year.

VIII. NEW BUSINESS – PART II

C. Equity and Social Justice Committee

This evening, during Audience of Citizens, the Board heard from members of the community on this topic. Ms. Dennis stated the Board will re-evaluate the structure of the Equity and Social Justice Committee moving forward at its retreat on March 13, 2022.

D. Facilities Related Updates

Director of Business Operations Jeffrey Cugno reported the stage lighting project at McGee Middle School will begin next month; the new band room at Griswold School, the classroom storage units at Hubbard School and the sky light at Hubbard School will be completed during April break; and the McGee library/media center lighting project, computer infrastructure and health suite will be completed during the summer of 2022.

Mr. Cugno stated the Willard School HVAC system project will not begin this summer. Mr. Cugno stated that on March 1, the Town Council will moved forward with appropriations; the plans and specifications are complete; and a Request for Proposal (RFP) will be put out for a construction manager. It is anticipated that this project will begin in the summer of 2023.

E. Open Choice Program Participation for 2022-2023

Superintendent Brian Benigni reported on the current number of Open Choice Program students in the Berlin schools and presented a recommendation to the Board regarding the level of participation for the 2022-2023 school year.

Superintendent Benigni provided Board members with a document reflecting, by grade, his recommended number of Open Choice students for 2022-2023. Superintendent Benigni reported the projected maintained seats for 2022-2023 are ninety-three (93) students. Superintendent Benigni recommended the district accommodate an additional twenty (20) students for the 2022-2023 school year and provided the Board with his recommendation for placement of these students within grade kindergarten (10) and first grade (10). Superintendent Benigni stated, if the district maintains the

ninety-three (93) students and fills the addition twenty (20) seats, the level of participation will be at 4.25%. If the district does not maintain the 4% level of participation, the amount of funding received from the state drops \$2,000 per student.

Moved by Dr. Sassu, seconded by Mr. Salina, to approve the superintendent's recommendation regarding the level of participation in the Open Choice Program for the 2022-2023 school year as presented.

F. Discussion of Graduation Site for 2022

Superintendent Benigni stated Central Connecticut State University has stated they would not be renting Welte Hall to any outside groups until at least the fall of 2022. Berlin High School Principal Eileen Eustis provided two options for the Board's consideration to hold commencement for the Class of 2022 at Sage Park this June if there is inclement weather on Friday, June 10. Board members were provided with the two options and a report of the graduation expenses for 2021 versus 2022.

Moved by Mr. Salina, seconded by Dr. Sassu, to hold commencement for the Class of 2022 at Sage Park.

Board members entered into a discussion, and Principal Eustis responded to the Board's questions regarding the two options. It was the consensus of the Board to move forward with Option Two.
