Facilities Related Updates

Director of Business Operations Roman J. Czuchta reported on the status of code renovations at Berlin High School: The budget for furniture, fixtures and equipment (FF&E) has been sent back to Silver/Petrucelli + Associates for review, and they have come back with some tentative numbers, but the numbers are nowhere near the \$1 million reduction. The Ad Hoc Renovation Committee is scheduled to meet with Silver/Petrucelli + Associates and Gilbane Building Company on Monday, December 16, 2013, regarding FF&E. Tom Smith of Gilbane Building Company has not provided the final date FF&E needs to go to the state so that when the classrooms are completed furniture will be in the rooms. Mr. Czuchta reported, if the rooms are completed at the beginning of April, he does not anticipate having equipment in place at that time. Over the weekend, there was some additional asbestos removal and the start of some PCB removals, which will continue through the rest of this week with clearances before the start of school next week. Notice was sent out a week ago to parents informing them that this was to occur and advising them of the procedures and precautions taken to ensure the areas were secure and fully contained. Mr. Czuchta met with FIP Construction and Gilbane Building Company regarding the concerns raised by staff, students and parents to mitigate the disruption to class time. Mr. Czuchta reported FIP Construction has been given the school's full schedule of testing dates so they are aware that at certain times certain areas of the building cannot be disturbed. FIP Construction did work a second shift while they were doing the retaining wall outside the science areas to again lessen any concerns regarding odors, specifically diesel fumes, in the building.

Update on the Senior Capstone □ Laurie Nelson, Berlin High School Capstone coordinator; high school administration; and Brian Benigni, assistant superintendent for curriculum and instruction, presented the requirements for the 2013-2014 Senior Capstone Project which is a graduation requirement for all seniors.
