Hubbard School, for being a hardworking, respectful, and caring student who has excelled in both character and performance in music class; Sarah Swanson, a grade five student at Richard D. Hubbard School, for demonstrating tremendous growth and skill development in physical education over her tenure at Hubbard; Ryan Sambitsky, a kindergarten student at Emma Hart Willard School, for making a wonderful transition to kindergarten; and Dawn Niles, an instructional paraprofessional at Emma Hart Willard School, for supporting students in various grade levels and working closely with them to support individual learning needs.

Student Presentation − *Berlin High School* □ BHS Student John Silva and Technology Teacher Jennifer Niro presented information to the Board regarding Tech xPerts, a group of independent study students who run a technology help desk for their peers and staff and also complete projects that further their learning in technology.

Personnel □ The Board appointed Eileen H. Eustis to the position of principal of Berlin High School, effective July 1, 2018.

Audience of Citizens □ Mayor Mark Kaczynski addressed the Board concerning the Board of Education and Town budgets and provided a history as to how the budget has materialized. He reported that, after the referendum, the budget went back to the Board of Finance where \$975,000 in reductions were made to the town budget. There were no reductions to the Board's budget. The Town Council will discuss the budgets at their meeting on May 15, 2018.

Facilities Related Updates □ Superintendent of Schools Brian Benigni reported that the pricing for the school security vestibules is higher than what was thought. The Town Council will discuss additional funding at its meeting on May 15, 2018. The Public Building Commission has hired a third-party engineering company to determine whether the ductwork at Berlin High School was installed properly. Drummy Rosane Anderson, Inc., hired to prepare the strategic planning study of the elementary schools, has met with the administrators and staff at each elementary school and has prepared a hardcopy survey to go out to all parents with elementary school children.

2018-2019 Board of Education's Operating Budget □ Board President Matthew Tencza reported that the Board of Finance moved the Board's budget to the Town Council with no cuts; however, there have been a number of cuts to capital requests, such as the installation of cages for athletic equipment at the high school, and electrical changes and the replacement of the phone system at McGee and the elementary schools. Mr. Tencza reported that he issued a letter to the mayor this morning requesting that the Town Council honor the Board's budget as further reductions will impact programs and services. The Town Council will meet on May 15, 2018, and the next referendum is on May 22, 2018.

Summer Reading Program □ Director of Literacy and Social Studies Laurie Gjerpen provided an overview of the 2018 summer reading program. Together with the Berlin-Peck Memorial Library, the schools are encouraging students to
